





# City Ruins Assembly Guide

**Straight Walls:** 














NOTE: Check the notches on the column piece match the walls















## City Ruins Assembly Guide

#### When planning your build here are some tips:

- These ruins can be assembled using either plastic cement or super glue.
- Before starting the assembly, plan out your building by dry fitting the pieces together, this will help you to ensure you use as many of the pieces as possible.
- The walls are double sided. You can have either the brick or plaster as the building exterior. This means you can build the same building twice, but still have them look different.
- You may find it easier to paint the pieces before assembly, as it can be difficult to hold some of the larger sections whilst painting.
- Keep any unused pieces as you may find them useful when building future ruins.

The contents of this box are easy to put together and with a little planning you can create a wide variety of interesting looking buildings. Below you can see three different examples, each built using the contents of just one box. If you want to create a larger, or centrepiece building for your forces to fight over, try combining two or more sets together.







### **Double-sided City and Rural Gaming Mat**
